General accessibility

We have a bus stop nearby.

This bus stop is more than 250 metres away.

The bus stop is called: Völs am Schlern, roundabout

These buses stop at this bus stop: 170, 176, 13, 2

We do not have a train station nearby.

We do not have a car park at the building.

We do not have a charging point for electric cars.

Electric cars use electricity.

Electric cars get electricity at a charging point.

We have an underground car park.

You can park your car in the underground car park.

The car can be 2 metres high.

Our website is accessible.

This is because our website follows these rules:

Web Content Accessibility Guidelines

This means:

All people can use and understand the information on our website.

For example, people with visual impairment can have the information read out loud.

There is no doorbell at our entrance.

So you cannot speak to a member of staff at the entrance.

We have a grandstand or a waiting room.

There we have designated seating areas for people with disabilities.



COMMITMENT TO ACCESSIBILITY

You do not need to pay an entrance fee.

Your dog is welcome here.



For families with small children and strollers

We do not have a parking space for pregnant women or parents with small children.

We have an entrance without steps.

So you can push your buggy into the building.

The path to the entrance is good for buggies.

Buggies roll well on the path.

We do not have a baby changing table.

You cannot change your child's nappies on a baby changing table.

We do not have a playground outside.

We do not have a playroom.

We do not have free childcare.

We do not have paid childcare.

You cannot rent a buggy.

You cannot rent a child carrier.

A child carrier is like a rucksack.

You can carry children in a child carrier.

For example, on a walk.



For people with a walking disability

We do not have a parking space for people with disabilities at the entrance.

The path to the entrance is good for wheelchairs.

Wheelchairs roll well on the path.

The path to the entrance is more than 120 centimetres wide.

The access path is not very steep.

The important doors in the building are at least 80 centimetres wide.

We do not have steps or stairs.

We have a toilet or a bathroom.

There is more than 150 centimetres by 150 centimetres of free space in the restroom.

We have an accessible toilet or an accessible bathroom.

There is more than 150 centimetres by 150 centimetres of space in the restroom.

There is less than 80 centimetres of space next to the toilet.

So wheelchairs cannot easily fit next to the toilet.

There is a grab bar on the wall in the accessible toilet.

And this grab bar is fixed to the wall.

A grab bar is a rail.

People can hold onto this rail.

This makes it easier for people to get on and off the toilet.

You can get to the sink with a wheelchair.

And you can also roll under the sink with a wheelchair.

We do not have a shower.

We do not have a swimming pool.

You cannot rent a wheelchair.

You cannot rent a walking frame.

You cannot borrow a shopping trolley that works with wheelchairs.



For people with a visual impairment

We do not have a tactile pathway to the building.

A tactile pathway has grooves.

People with a visual impairment feel these grooves.

They can feel them with their white stick or with their feet.

The grooves show the way.

This way, people with a visual impairment can find the building's entrance.

We do not have tactile pathways in the building.

The steps in the building do not have good contrast.

No contrast means that the steps are hard to see.

For example:

The floor and the edges of the steps are the same colour.

This way, people with a visual impairment cannot see the steps easily.

The steps in the building are not tactile.

Not tactile means:

People with a visual impairment cannot feel the edges of the steps easily.

The path to the entrance is at least 2 metres high.

And you cannot hit your head anywhere.

We do not have a dog walking area for guide dogs.

We do have a lift.

Our lift has buttons with Braille.

There is a speaker system in the lift.

This speaker system says the floors out loud.

There is an information board in the lift.

The board shows you, for example:

- Where can you find the entrance?
- Or where can you find the toilet?

You cannot find interesting things like a picture or artwork in our rooms.

Our staff do not know how to help people with visual impairment.



For people with a hearing impairment and deaf people

We do not have a hearing loop for hearing aids.

A hearing loop is a device for people with hearing impairment.

This device helps these people to hear better.

C'è un ascensore.

There is a visual display board in the lift.

On this display board, you can see which floor you are on.

We do not have a visual alarm system for emergencies.

This means that no light flashes in an emergency.

Our staff do not know how to help people with a hearing impairment.

Our videos always have subtitles.



For people with learning difficulties or cognitive disabilities

Our website does not have information in Easy-to-read Language.

Our website has easy-to-understand information.

There are pictures and symbols as well as words.

We have different areas and floors.

Each area and floor is the same colour.

It might not be easy to find your way around.

There are no signs in the areas and floors.

It might not be easy to find your way around here.

You cannot shop with us.

The staff can give you information in an easy-to-understand language.

Our staff do not know how to help people with learning difficulties or cognitive disabilities.
